

Prayerwalking Project Coordinator

The Church Prayerwalking Project Coordinator (PPC)

This role is critical for the success of the prayer initiative in both the local church and First Coast Churches. All communication between FCC team and the local church comes through the Prayerwalking Project Coordinator. Churches are not required to have a coordinator, but it is highly suggested due to the comprehensive scope of this project.

The Role of the PPC

Here are some suggestions on the responsibilities of the church Prayer Project Coordinator.

- To *lead* and *manage* the project from registration to completion
- Be the church's champion for the prayerwalking initiative
- Recruit, equip, and lead a prayerwalking team to develop a strategy and a plan to make it happen
- Provide resources and/or training to equip the prayerwalking team and those who participate in walking the harvest field. Please check out the resources section for blog articles and PDF's that provide a basic understanding of the concepts of prayerwalking.
- To report your church's prayerwalking efforts to the FCC so our team has the ability to track and evaluate the progress of the project

The Prayerwalking Team

- To work with the PPC in developing a prayerwalking strategy
- The assist the PPC in implementing the strategy for the prayerwalking project
- Provide clerical, digital, or organizational support for implementing the team's strategy

Suggestions for inviting existing organizational resources into the Prayerwalking Project

There are a variety of individuals and groups who provide a diverse prayerwalking force to engage the city. Here are a few.

- Encourage Bible study groups or Life Groups to adopt sections of your zone to prayerwalk
- Invite another church to join you in praying the zone you have chosen
- Encourage persons to form two-person teams (a biblical precedent) to engage communities together
- Encourage families to prayerwalk in the area where they live. Prayerwalking with children goes a long way toward developing the next prayerwalking generation. This activity also exponentially advances the development of missional DNA in children.
- Include prayerwalking as part of a church social event (picnic or game day)
- Invite people who are not physically able to prayerwalk to join the project by implementing an alternative way to pray.
 - Ask cyclists to consider prayer-ride portions of the zone(s)
 - Prayer-ride in an automobile, stopping periodically to pray over specific areas
 - Take a hard copy of a prayer map and commit to pray specifically for that area
 - Encourage persons to go online, choose a map (or maps) and pray periodically over these areas

Celebrate Your Prayerwalking Progress

Post your pictures (share your prayerwalking story) on the **LOVEjax Facebook** page. This is an excellent way to celebrate by publicly praising God for the work He is doing as you engage the city in prayer.
